participated to celebrate Kargil Diwas as a victory and inculcate patriotic values in students.



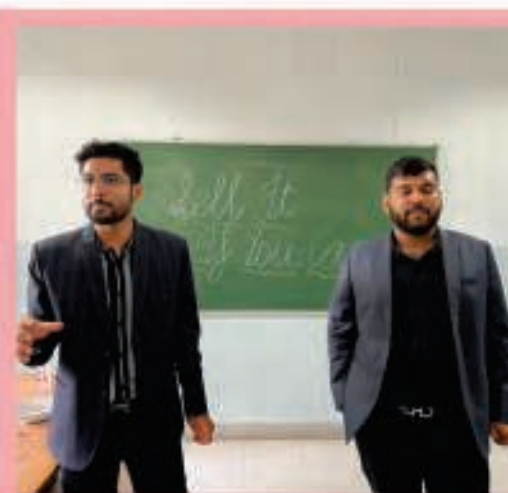




## BUSINESS CONCLAVE

## The idea of nuclear power

The idea of nuclear power began in the 1930s, when physicist Enrico Fermi first showed that neutrons could split atoms. Enrico Fermi led a team that in 1942 achieved the first nuclear chain reaction, under a stadium at the University of Chicago. On June 27, 1954, the Obninsk Nuclear Power Plant in the USSR became the world's first nuclear power plant to generate electricity for a power grid, producing around 5 megawatts of electric power. This was the origin of the concept of producing electricity from nuclear energy & soon many countries started using it. In a nuclear power

plant, nuclear energy is used to produce electricity. A nucleus of the chemical Uranium - 235 stored in iron rods along with a neutron is used to create a nuclear fission. Nuclear fission produces energy. Nuclear fission is the division of a nucleus into nuclei of roughly equal mass, accompanied by a release of a large amount of the binding energy of the subatomic particles. The energy appears as Kinetic energy of the fragments which converts into thermal energy as the fragments collide with matter & slow down. The nuclear fission also releases 2 or 3 free neutrons which can bombard other nuclei leading to a series of fissions called a chain reaction. A critical mass, large enough to allow more than 1 fission-produced neutron to be captured is necessary to achieve a self-sustaining nuclear chain reaction. A critical mass is the minimum amount of a given fissionable material necessary to achieve a self-sustaining chain reaction. A critical mass depends on several factors - the kind of fissionable material, its concentration & purity, its composition & the geometry of the surrounding reaction system. An electrophile is an atom or molecule that seeks an electron pair for bonding. Electrons are the lightest electrically charged subatomic particles carrying a negative charge - the basic charge of electricity & has a mass of less than 0.1% of the mass of an atom.

Under normal circumstances, electrons move about the nucleus of an atom. An electric charge is the quantity of electricity that flows in an electric current. It occurs in discrete natural units equal to the charge of an electron or proton. A positive charge can combine with a negative charge, resulting in a net charge of zero. An electric current is the movement of electric charge carriers. In a wire, electric current is a flow of electrons that have been dislodged from atoms & is a measure of the quantity of electric charge passing any point of the wire per unit time. While producing electricity, steam is emitted & processed with the energy. Then, the electricity produced is sent to homes through a transmitter. It is preferred by the people at the power plant to supply the electricity in high voltage because it is easier.

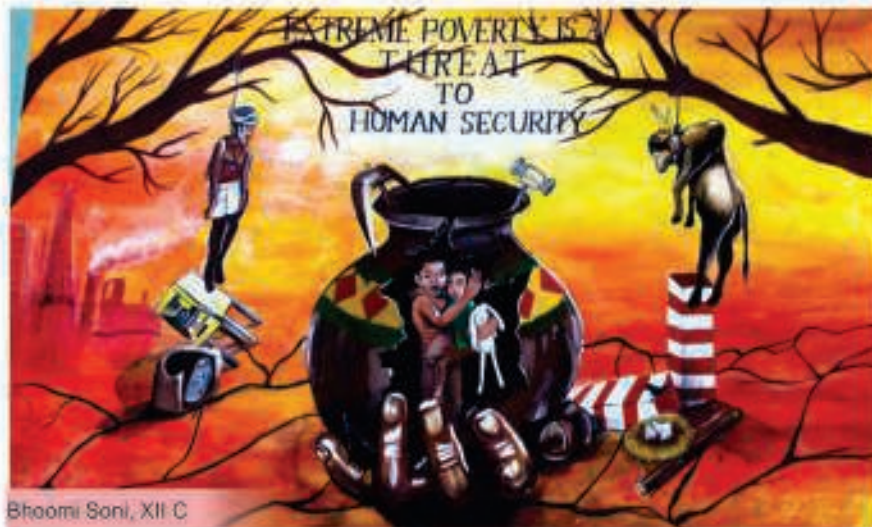

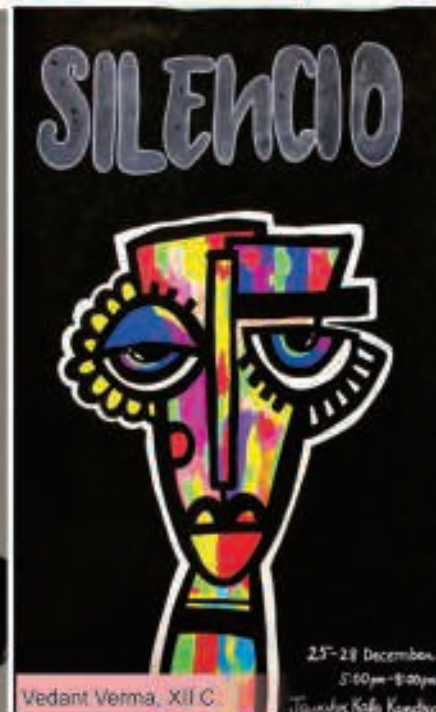

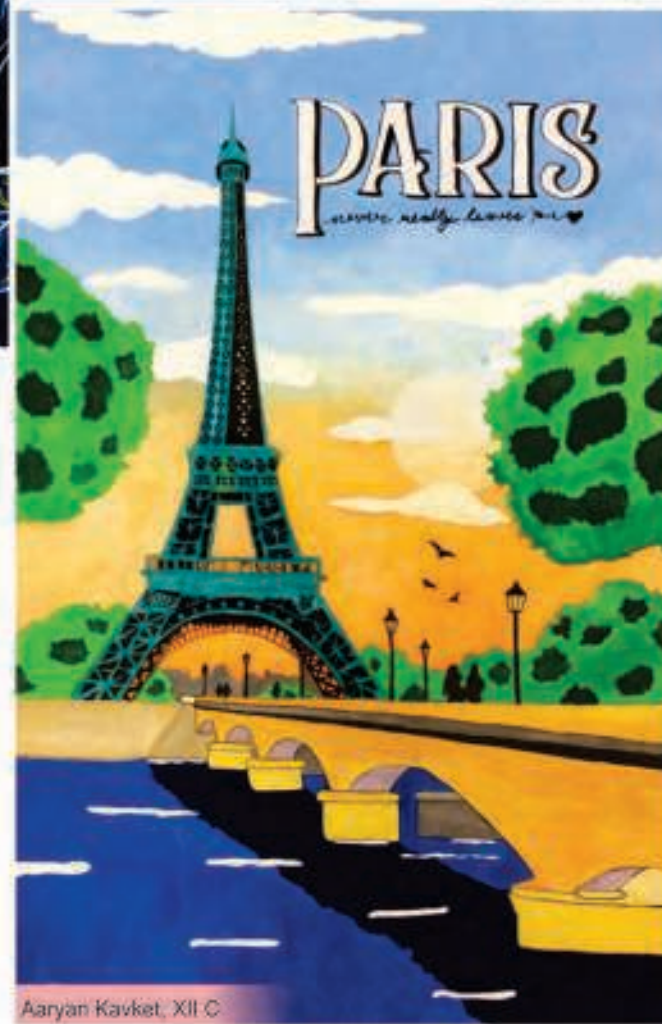
