Farewell



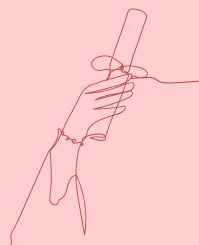
*Though time has come to say goodbye,

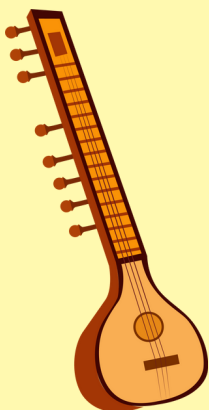


BASANT PANCHMI

He gave us nature

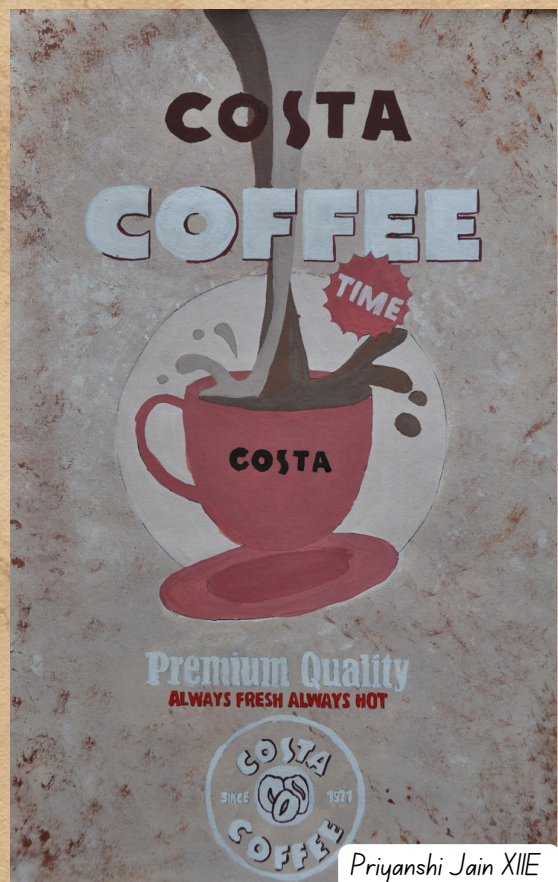
But we couldn't nourish them.
