CULTURAL WEEK



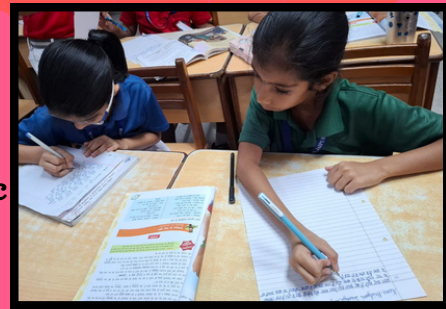

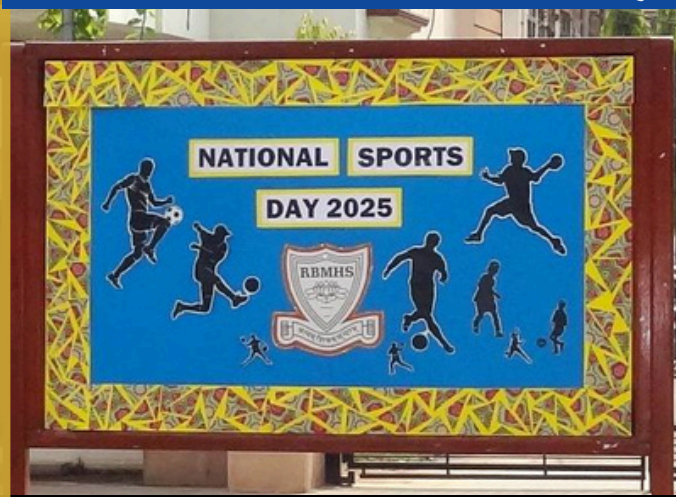


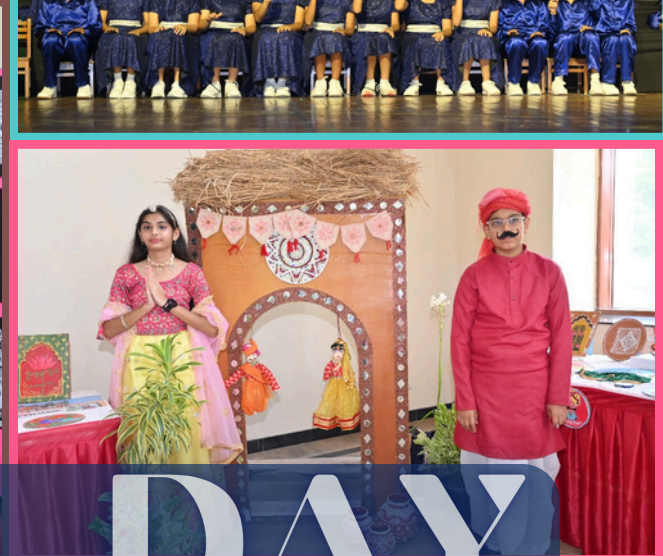

INTERNATIONAL LITERACY DAY

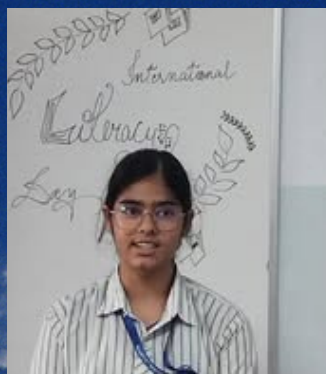

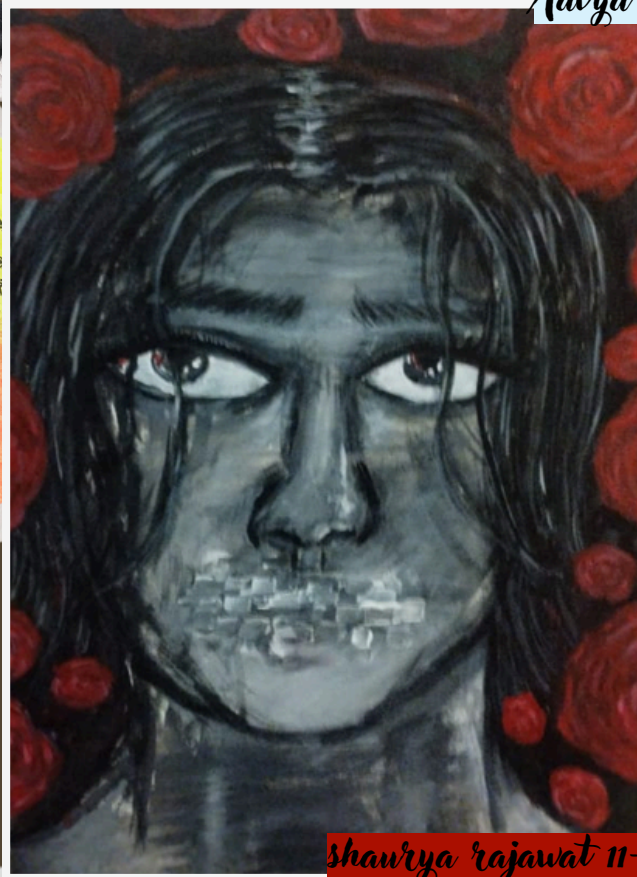

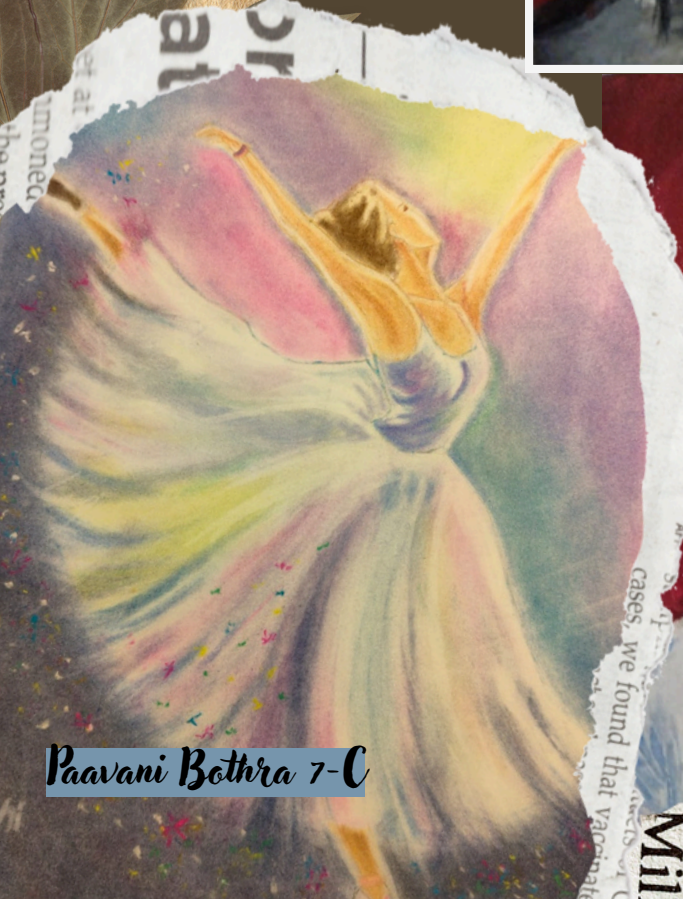

Modhera: The Solar Power-Meeting Heritage

Modhera is a small village in Gujarat with the well known 11th century Sun Temple which was constructed by the Solanki dynasty. The architecture is already mythical: it is so harmonized that the sun is rising in the sky at the equinoxes, and penetrates through the main entrance into the innermost sanctum without darkness. It is important to note that the nature of the tourism industry is determined by tourist preferences.

However, in the recent years, Modhera has gained fame not only on something very modern, that is, it has been declared the first 24x 7 village in the country that is solar-powered.

The Real meaning of Solar Village:

Gujarat authorities and the government had installed more than 1,297 rooftop solar PV systems in residential places and additional solar power in government buildings. The Ministry of New and Renewable Energy is responsible for the reorganization of the state's energy industry.

It was also equipped with a large ground-mounted solar plant (6 MW), a battery energy storage system (BESS) of 15 MWh, thus making it work even without the sun. The Ministry of New and Renewable Energy is responsible for the reorganization of the state's energy industry.

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Smart meters, solar EV-charging stations, and solar PV panels throughout the village ensure that the electricity charges of several household bills are significantly reduced- nearly none whatsoever. (OpIndia)

So, the mixture is not real: old temple in honor of the Sun, and a village which works with the help of its energy.

Secret Lives: Things Secret

1. Architecture astronomy: The Sun Temple was designed so accurately that in equinoxes the first rays would enter the innermost areas of the building and in summer solstice the building would cast virtually no shadow at a certain angle. (Architectural Digest India)

2. Diamond idol legend: It is believed that there was a diamond cut into the head of the idol of the Sun God. The diamond would shine and enhance the spectacle once the sunlight was in the right angle. Invasions then proceeded to loot that idol.

3. Solar heritage lighting: There is a 3D light and sound show projected on the temple now powered by the sun. The projection map on the face of the temple is entirely powered on solar electricity with lighting systems designed to suit old buildings. (palmtechnology.in)

Why It Matters

Modhera is not just another tourist destination. It is a representation: how ancient knowledge (solar orientation, temple buildings) and new science (solar panels and batteries and smart grids) can not only coexist but also even complement one another. To the students, it is a lesson that innovation does not always involve abandoning the old because sometimes the past has in-built brilliance in it that we are only rediscovering. And sunly power-- physical and symbolic--is a nice power.
